Drowning is a leading cause of preventable death in children under five. Pool owners must comply with laws requiring secure barriers and supervision to ensure safety.

Registration, Fencing, and CPR Signage

Pools must be registered, surrounded by compliant safety barriers, and display CPR signage that is clear and in good condition.

SAFETY FIRST

Selling, Renting, and Certification Requirements
Selling or renting properties with pools requires
valid compliance certificates. Inspections by
councils or certifiers ensure safety standards are
